- Have ties with Belgium and demonstrate a special interest in our country
- play an important role in the social life of your jurisdiction;
- maintain good relations with the authorities of your jurisdiction;
- have no personal and/or business interests that could lead to a conflict of interest;
- have sufficient own resources to ensure the functioning of the honorary consular post (i.e. an office you can receive visitors in);
- reside in the jurisdiction we are looking for an honorary consul (West Florida, Alabama or Tennessee);
